ForrestPerkins' renovation of the legendary Fairmont Hamilton Princess Hotel's Gold wing, long the home away from home for international business executives, defines luxury in an unrivaled setting. Believed by many to be the most beautiful room in Bermuda, the Fairmont Gold Lounge reflects the neoclassic style of 18th Century British architect Robert Adam. ForrestPerkins restored the room to its original elegance, incorporating a soft-toned palette of pinks, greens and grays to enhance the delicate decoration of the walls and ceiling. A notable feature of the design is an electronic jacquard Axminster carpet, which incorporates nautical elements – the anchor, shell, pearl and dolphin – as well as the Bermuda Rose into its unique period design. A fully equipped executive boardroom conveys the sense of elegance and detail that the directors of some of the world's leading Bermuda-based corporations expect.

ForrestPerkins provided interior architecture and design for eighty-seven exclusive concierge level rooms and eight suites, including the Presidential Suite. The design schemes are distinctive, a result of extensive research into the homes and lifestyles of the original Bermudian settlers. The designers utilized locally significant motifs like the "Bermuda Onion" in concert with striking natural materials such as marble and granite to provide the experience of being a guest in an elegant Bermudian home.
